

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PRESENTATION OF THE BIBLIOGRAPHIC DESCRIPTION IN PUBLICATIONS IN ENGLISH

The list of references is provided based on the widely used international **APA** (American Psychological Association) citation standard. It has been slightly modified and adapted to the reference list in Lithuanian to maintain uniformity. It is very important to provide the reference list **alphabetically**. It is usually numbered. Personal names in a foreign language are in bold. Titles of books, journals, newspapers and conferences are bold, and titles of articles are in regular font. The reverse is true for the names of the authors' collective (institution, organisation) and the titles of the books: the former are in bold and the latter in italics. The words in the titles of books, journals, newspapers, conferences, organisations and institutions in foreign languages are capitalised (according to the rules of the specific language), and in the titles of other sources they are lowercased.

References to the cited source in the body of the text are provided in brackets at the end of the text being cited or retold. **Note.** For technical sciences, the number is provided in square brackets.
